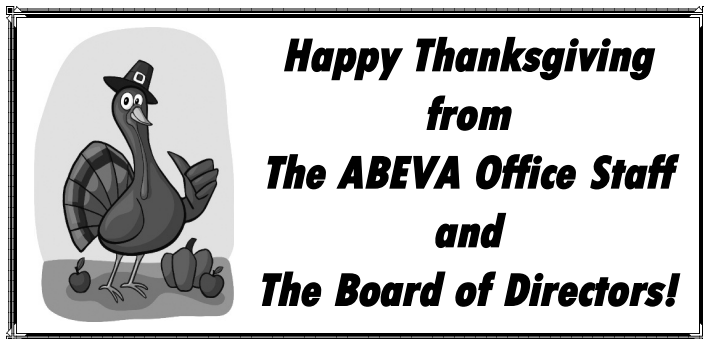

Letter from Officer Carro

The following article was written by our past Community Action Officer, but bears repeating:

I would like to share some thoughts on two laws that are commonly violated in the Biltmore. **The first being dog at large violations and the second is criminal trespassing.**

A dog at large is currently a city code violation under P.C.C. 8-14 and trespassing, as it relates to real property, is a state code, ARS 13-1502A. I am reaching out to the entire Biltmore community in hopes of educating the residents and obtaining voluntary compliance. It is my goal to work together towards making the Biltmore a safer community for all to enjoy. I am asking for your assistance in educating the members of the community who may not have access to this communication.

As we continue to enjoy this beautiful fall weather, I would like to provide a friendly reminder of the dog at large ordinance within the City of Phoenix. Phoenix city code 8-14 defines the code and explains when and where a dog at large within the City of Phoenix is permitted. This is a commonly violated law that is not protected by the claim of "private property."

Locations such as The Arizona Biltmore Hotel, The Arizona Biltmore golf course, or any of the open common areas within the community are all private property locations where a dog must be kept on a leash. A violation of this ordinance is classified as a misdemeanor and is subject to prosecution.

Criminal trespassing in the third degree relates to real property of another where someone unlawfully enters or remains after given a reasonable request to leave by the owner or any other person having lawful control over such property. Reasonable notice prohibiting entry is also required. A reasonable request is simply being asked to leave and informing someone that they are trespassing. A reasonable notice prohibiting entry is a "No Trespassing" sign. This law can be prosecuted with either of the two components listed above.

Please assist me in helping your community gain voluntary compliance with respect to these two commonly violated laws.

Neighborhood Reminders

Now that the temperature is finally cooling down, people will be out walking again. Please walk on the sidewalks or the edge of the road. Two people have been hit on Biltmore Estates Drive, and we do not want the next one to be you.

When you are walking your dog, please remember to pick up after your dog. ABEVA has three dog waste stations: one across from 33 Biltmore Estates Drive (at the south end of the oleanders), a station that ABEVA maintains on the SRP canal bank, and one across the street from 9 Biltmore Estates Drive (the Paul Harvey house). Thank you for using these waste stations and complying with the Phoenix City Code 27-12, please remind others to use them. Also, if you notice the stations need maintenance, please call the ABEVA office.

Please be considerate of your neighbors and do not let your dog bark continuously. In Phoenix, it is a Class 1 misdemeanor for any person to let a dog bark, howl or disturb the peace and quiet of another person (Phoenix Barking Dog Ordinance). If you have been informed your dog is disturbing another person's peace, you need to take action to stop the barking. ❖

CADDISFLIES in the Biltmore!

The ABEVA office has had several calls and emails about these pesky flies, and people asking what can be done to get rid of them. This article from Central Arizona Project (CAP) will help you learn about the flying insect called caddisfly and what you can do if you

live adjacent to the canal and are experiencing these on your property. The good news is as the canal water temperature gets cooler the flies do not hatch.

Living near a body of water, including water conveyance canals, is an appealing proposition to many people. However, what most of us forget is that water is also attractive to wildlife and is home to a multitude of insects and other organisms. One of those insects found in the canals is the caddisfly, which spends most of its life in water. Although they are harmless to humans and pets, they can be a nuisance when they emerge from the water in spring and fall.

Larval caddisflies feed on algae and mature in the water, typically in self-made casings. Changes in water temperature trigger the caddisflies to leave their casings and swim to the water surface where they emerge as adults. They survive for several weeks after emergence with the sole purpose of mating. During this time, they are most active at dawn and dusk, and they search for shade (vegetation, patios, etc.) during the heat of the day. In Arizona, we see the primary emergence of caddisflies in May and September. After mating, females return to the canal to lay their eggs and start the cycle all over again.

Caddisflies are extremely important to the aquatic ecosystem, because they are an integral component in the food chain. Not only are they a food source for many species of fish, they also filter much of the algae and other organisms in the water that can cause taste and odor problems. Regardless of the importance of caddisflies to the environment, scientists have been trying to control nuisance populations since the early 1900s. Adult caddisflies do not have mouthparts, but they are still a nuisance for residents that live along the CAP. Since 2007, CAP has invested significant time, labor, and financial resources into researching control mechanisms that will help to lessen the caddisfly impact to our neighbors. Unfortunately, their findings are no different than what scientists have concluded for the past 100 years: there is no effective, responsible method to significantly reduce or eliminate caddisfly populations. From 2009-2011, CAP scraped the canal to remove caddisflies, but it proved to be ineffective and damaged the canal liner.

Research has shown that several fish species, including channel catfish, will eat larval caddisflies and may provide some control. Since 2011, CAP has stocked channel catfish into various locations in the canal in early spring to eat caddisflies. Although results are mixed, residents generally report that conditions have improved since the catfish stockings began.

Different environmental factors will cause population densities to fluctuate, but there is currently no mechanism that will eliminate caddisflies from the CAP. Although CAP continues to look into alternative control methods, caddisflies and other insects will always be in the canal.

We understand your frustrations when caddisflies are swarming. Here are a few suggestions to help reduce their impact near your home: Replace white light bulbs with yellow lights that attract fewer insects. Reduce the amount of vegetation near your home and consider screening your patio. Caddisflies are not strong fliers, so a fan on a "high" setting may keep them away from certain areas. Bug zappers may attract caddisflies away from "sitting areas," but may also attract more caddisflies to your yard. Use an insect fogger for temporary relief (caddisflies will likely return in a day or less). ❖
