Highlights from the September 12th Meeting

- The annual budget for fiscal year 2011/2012 was approved. The annual fee will remain at \$275.00 if paid by November 30th. Invoices were mailed September 30th to all addresses of record. Late fees will be applied on December 1st.
- Jay Swart reported on the Camelback East Village Planning Association meeting. There is a plan to develop the old R & G property on Indian School Rd., next to Arcadia High School. The plan includes some restaurants as well as open space. Since neighbors complained, building height has been reduced to two stories. Another piece of business was the approval of Charles Schwab's plan to build a parking lot where the old Phoenix Police Department precinct was.
- Jay also reported on Security. Trucks are being parked dangerously around the Biltmore Resort on Arizona Biltmore Circle. Jay recommended that we send a strong letter to the resort requiring them to use the staging area on their property for trucks. At Jay's request, the city met with the resort and will send them a notice requiring adherence to the staging area. The Board passed a motion to approve a letter requesting the hotel to immediately prohibit all trucks stopping on the road
- A proposal in the amount of \$1,253 was approved for ValleyCrest to replace dead and missing oleanders along Biltmore Estates Drive.
- There were questions about the now operational cameras on Thunderbird Trail and Godown Road and what was being done with these images. The cameras were installed by the resort per an agreement with several loop road owners who formed B.C.I.C. They are solely responsible for the monitoring of these cameras. Should there be an incident the police will be able to have access to the information.

From the ABEVA Office

The Executive Director attended a seminar at the Mountain View Precinct Police Department on Metal Theft. Several sub associations within ABEVA, along with the rest of the valley, have been experiencing an increase in this type of theft. Thieves are not just taking copper, but any metal; catalytic converters, cemetery vases, air conditioner copper, back flow assemblies, water meter & manhole covers, pool equipment, etc. They police told of one incident where a brand new car

was turned into the scrap yard, and it had already been crushed when they found it. A scrap metal company in attendance has five locations in the valley and does about 1,000 transactions per day. There are about 90 scrap yards in the city of Phoenix.

SO, WHAT CAN YOU DO? One thing mentioned was locking down air conditioners. When a thief steals copper from you're a/c they get about \$100 at most. However, they destroy the unit costing you many thousands. We were made aware of two types of systems:

The Dorcey, which can be adapted to fit almost any unit. It is the first line of defense against stripping of HVAC coils and condensers, copper from electrical entrance boxes and other metal that can easily be sold as scrap. The system was developed by TIP Maintenance Inc. If you would like more information on the Dorsey, call TIP in Phoenix at 602-272-6601. Costs range from \$225-\$300. The 2nd type is more like a cage.

5 tips for Preparing to Overseed for Winter From ABEVA's Landscaper ValleyCrest Landscape Maintenance

If you'll be overseeding your warm season Bermuda grass this fall, follow our 5 tips before you get started.

- 1: Overseed in the first 3 weeks of October or when evening temperatures are consistently below 65
- 2: Prior to overseeding, turn off turf irrigation to slow growth of Bermuda grass.
- 3: Drop mowing height to 1/4" to 1/2" to remove all green tissue (may need to mow 2-3 times).
- 4: Do not dethatch just before overseeding. Dethatching should be done in the summer because, if performed too close to overseeding, it can weaken your Bermuda so it may not survive winter dormancy.
- 5: Purchase 10-15 pounds of perennial ryegrass seed per 1,000 square feet of lawn for the best coverage. ■


