# Highlights of the May 21, 2012 **Board of Directors Meeting**

- The Biltmore Community Neighborhood Association (BCNA) is a group of homeowners living on Biltmore Estates Drive and Thunderbird Trail now working on behalf of all the homeowners in that area. They have hired off-duty policemen to patrol BED, Thunderbird Trail, and Colter.
- A homeowner from Two Biltmore Estates presented a request for those homeowners to become full members of ABEVA with voting privileges. Currently, each homeowner pays dues. They use ABEVA's roads, but cannot vote or hold office on ABEVA's Board. The homeowner will work through the process in ABEVA's Bylaws to fully vest Two Biltmore Estates as ABEVA homeowners.
- Jay Swart reported that the Camelback East Village Planning Committee approved the development of a new high-end condo complex at 36th St. and Campbell. Bill Smith is the developer. Mr. Smith has promised that construction will begin in 13 months.
- The Board approved changes to the Fifth Amended Bylaws as recommended by our attorney. Once completed, they will be posted on the website and emailed to those we have email addresses for.
- The Board received an update on Lincoln Plaza. Café Daniel will move into a space on the west side of the plaza. The Board also noted that at 32nd Street and Camelback, Central Bistro will move into the space formerly occupied by Zen 32.
- The Board approved a contribution of \$250 to the Tour De Force. Our own Community Action Officer, Ben Carro, will be riding in this 9/11 Memorial Bike Ride. All funds raised in the event will support fallen officers, especially the families of the September 11th tragedy.
- · Colony Biltmore IV asked the ABEVA Board to resume landscaping the flowers at Arizona Biltmore Circle and Claremont. The Board approved this change.
- The Board learned that David Kirken has been named General Manager of the Arizona Biltmore. He comes from La Quinta Resort and Club® and PGA West®, a Waldorf Astoria resort property, located in La Quinta, California.
- In order to better advance the budgeting process, the date of the Board meeting originally scheduled for September 17th was changed to September 10th.

## Legislative Session

The Legislature ended its 116 day session on May 3, 2012. Although 24 bills were introduced that dealt specifically with community associations, two bills passed. These have been signed by the Governor and will become effective August 2, 2012:

- HB2471 clarified conflicting legislation about political, For Sale and For Lease signs.
- SB1476 in part mandates that all ACC Committees be chaired by a member of the board of directors. It further requires new builds or rebuilds on any lot to perform certain duties.

For almost two years the Meridian Condominiums have been having copper theft from their parking garages. Thanks to the efforts of our Officer in Charge, Richard Herrera, they have been caught.

## From Community Action Officer, Ben Carro

Today around 10:30 a.m. officers responded to 5104 N. 32nd Street in reference to a metal theft call (copper theft). The alert security guard did a great job obtaining a description of not only the subjects involved but also the vehicle, its color and last known direction of travel. This witness was crucial in the identification process. Myself, and officers from the 71A and 71B patrol squads, Phoenix Police Air Support Unit (helicopter) and officers from Paradise Valley Police all worked together to effect the arrest.

Two subjects were observed in the Meridian Condominiums cutting large pieces of copper from the parking garage. (approximately 25 feet of 1 inch copper) They were followed out to N. 32nd street then fled eastbound on Stanford and ultimately ended up in Paradise Valley. During our search of the area, I alerted a Paradise Valley officer of the crime, subjects and vehicle we were looking for. That











officer broadcast the information to other officers within the Paradise Valley Police Department. Within minutes our police helicopter located the suspect vehicle which had been stopped by a Paradise Valley Officer in a remote area of their town. With that officer alone holding two subjects at gunpoint and back up minutes away, our police helicopter landed in a vacant lot adjacent to the stop and the co-pilot exited the aircraft to assist. After dropping off the co-pilot, the helicopter immediately took flight to ensure scene security from a birds eye view. Both officers did an outstanding job maintaining control over the suspects until additional patrol officers (myself, officer Shclender and another Paradise Valley officer) arrived on scene. These are very dangerous and volatile situations which are extremely dynamic and fluid in nature. They pose a lot of unknown risks such as an officer's safety and the safety of the general public. The air support officers recognized this and immediately acted on behalf of the Paradise Valley officer. This was a job well done by everyone involved and as a result of some excellent police work, two burglars are off the street.

Damaged/Stolen property was recovered, and both sub-

jects were booked into jail on multiple felony charges.

Richard was presented with a Securitas watch from his branch manager at the ABEVA office on May 29th. The Security Committee was all present.

## From ABEVA's Landscaper Five Landscape Tips for June

- June is typically the driest month of the year. Pay attention to the irrigation needs of trees and plants.
- Flush irrigation cycles for soils with high sodium / salt content. Double the normal run time at least once per month.
- Apply mulch to the ground around heat sensitive plants to keep roots cooler and prevent evaporation.
- Prune palms after the palm has finished flowering.
- Cut off spent blooms of shrubs to stimulate new flowers.

William Wrigley Jr. was a very skeptical man and thought that if a car was driven around too often, it would blow up! So, he decided to buy a car for each day of the week, excluding Sundays when driving was not necessary. Therefore, the Wrigley Mansion was built with a six-car garage which is now named the Garden Room. Many wedding receptions, proms and corporate events are held in the original six-car garage, a beautiful space that can accommodate up to 800 people. Most guests may not even realize the Garden Room used to be a six car garage! The original garage space (see arches on the left) is now the beautiful Garden Room.
