Letter From Officer Ben Carro:

ABEVA Residents:

We are moving into the dead of summer and although we may like to beat the heat, crime is very much a concern in our neighborhoods. I fortunately have the opportunity to work with many neighborhoods, businesses, and community groups. I cover the areas from SR51 to Scottsdale, Lincoln to Osborn. Within those boundaries we see all types of crimes but most notably property crimes. Property crimes can be prevented if WE the community reduce the opportunity for the criminal element. Certainly, property crimes can be random, but through increased awareness and vigilance we can prevent them.

The Chief of Police Daniel V. Garcia has had reign over your police department for over one year now. **Under his leadership we have adopted the following Mission, Vision, and Community Policing Model.**

Mission: We will serve, protect and reduce crime in Phoenix while treating everyone with dignity and respect.

Our Vision: We will earn your trust and respect by increasing our community policing efforts and creating teams to support outreach and participation. The result will be public/private partnerships that enhance our safety, security and our community's livability.

FOCUS on Five KEY on Three:

- *PERSONS WHO COMMIT CRIMES
- *PLACES WHERE CRIMES ARE COMMITTED
- -High Priority Enforcement
- -High Priority Offense Locations
- *BEHAVIORS THAT LEAD TO CRIME (SUSPICION)

Safe communities are the result of shared responsibility and vision. The Phoenix Police Department prides itself on strengthening partnerships with neighborhoods and public/private organizations to ensure implementation of policing strategies. Keying on the persons, places, and behaviors as a team will reduce crime and make our community safer.

*PERSONS

"Key on Three" begins with focusing on those criminals who can destroy a neighborhood. Focusing on arresting drug dealers, gang members, burglars, robbers and repeat offenders increases the safety and security of our community. Valuable information from the public can help police identify criminals who prey upon our community.

*PLACES

Identifying places where crime frequently occurs or "High Priority Offense Locations" (HPOL) is critical to identifying where police resources needs to be deployed. This gives officers direction as they develop plans for "High Priority Enforcement Locations" (HPEL). Real time data-driven intelligence allows the police to focus on criminal activity.

*BEHAVIORS

Criminal behaviors such as illegal drug use, neighborhood blight, graffiti, and auto theft often lead to more violent crimes such as burglary, robbery and homicides. The philosophy and goal of the Police Department is to inform and









educate the community on how to work side-by-side with law enforcement and city service coordination teams to improve our community. Stopping crime begins with correcting behaviors that lead to more severe crimes.

Community policing is a partnership between the community and the police. You are the eyes and ears of your communities and without you the police department would be at a great loss. Please ensure you are remaining aware and vigilant in and outside of your neighborhoods as crime has no boundaries. Ensure the safety and security of your homes and vehicles, by locking them at all times and securing your valuable items.
