How to Take a Golf Lesson by Tina Tombs

In the many years that I have been giving golf lessons to players of all abilities one thing is confirmed. The majority of golfers receive more pleasure and satisfaction from the game if they take a series of lessons versus one lesson from their golf professional. Many times just a FEW changes in the golf swing can and will end years of frustration and will make both the learning and playing experience more enjoyable.


Sign on to visit the website by going to www.abeva.com. If you do not yet have a login name and password, from the menu on the left choose e-forms, then choose login request, fill out the required information and click submit. Taking a golf lesson is much more than just showing up at the appointed time with a bag of clubs, and a bucket of balls. For the student and teacher to make a golf lesson a positive experience both must participate physically and mentally. The Student must, in good faith, listen and ask questions if there is something that the student does not understand. The teacher must be able to communicate and to interact with the student. Both are very important, and I believe they are what can make the sessions successful!

First you want to arrive early to warm up with a few practice balls. I require 15-20 minutes to give you ample time to warm up without getting too tired before your lesson. Second, let your instructor know if you have, any physical disabili-

ties that may hinder your range of motion or your ability to execute the way your instructor is teaching you. Third, discuss with your instructor where you are having difficulties and where you want to improve. This would be a good time to discuss goals and a schedule for your lessons to reach your goals. Fourth, pay ATTENTION to your INTENTION and give yourself the best opportunity to learn. Paying attention to your intentions is required to improve your golf swing and to be able to repeat it in practice situations as well as on the golf course.

Do not expect miracles in one lesson. Improvement in golf is not always as fast as we would like it to be. Patience and commitment to improving your golf swing is a journey with dedication and repetition. Make it fun and enjoy the journey! Smell the roses along the way!
