Home Security

There has been an increase in homeowners leaving their garage doors open. Roving patrol only reports garage doors left open at night, and homeowners don't get notified until the next day. Before you go to bed make a quick check of your doors, windows, and garage. Be safe out there.

Leash Law Enforcement

I would like to reiterate the leash law within the City of Phoenix, an ordinance that could yield a civil or criminal citation if violated. I am not going to dissect the law with you, but I am going to ask that you please share with your friends and

neighbors the importance of maintaining control of your dogs on a leash whenever you are not within a designated dog park or a FENCED front or rear yard.

Like many of you, I am a dog lover and a responsible dog owner. As responsible dog owners we must abide by the city code and also respect those who are not comfortable with our pets off leashes. Recently, a woman in my area sustained injuries when a dog off leash ran up to her knocking her down while a scuffle took place.

This issue has been a long standing issue in our area, and in the past I have focused my efforts on gaining compliance through education and documented verbal warnings. In some cases this approach has not worked, as I have repeatedly contacted some of the same people who continually violate the law, despite being warned and/or receiving citations.

The leash law is in place to protect ALL citizens of our city and also acts as a potential buffer from civil litigation if your off leash dog attacks another dog or a person while off leash.

Some of our heavily violated areas are our city parks where our citizens share the responsibility to ensure a safe environment for all. A dog off leash in a city park can create an uncomfortable and an unsafe environment. I would ask that you consider others before unleashing your dogs in a park consider the consequences you may face if you choose to violate this law. A complaint to the police department requires our response and takes us away from the more pressing issues in your area.

I will be changing my approach and response to dogs at large. After a violation the initial contact will result in a documented warning if you are contacted again and found to be in violation. You will receive the appropriate citation.

Please help me help you, by keeping your dogs on leash. I promise you my time is better served in your neighborhoods focusing my efforts on the property crimes plaguing our area.
