2017 ANNUAL MEETING DIRECTORS REPORT Highlights from 2015/2016

The Annual Meeting of the Arizona Biltmore Estates Village Association (ABEVA) was held at the Arizona Biltmore Resort in the Gold Room on February 16th and was attended by approximately 75 ABEVA members. The guest speaker was Ryan Fitzgerald, the Resort Manager of the Arizona Biltmore Resort. He discussed the remodeling of the resort. Room renovations will continue, and there is no timeline for this project. They are looking into enhancing the banquet spaces. A homeowner brought up an issue with the lighting and a directional sign on Thunderbird Trail, and Ryan said this item will be addressed by the Resort. He confirmed that there are no plans to expand the resort at this time.

The following ABEVA members were elected to the Board for two year terms: Judith Shafkind, Jim Bell, Phil Tibi, and William Hawking. The officers elected February 20th are: James Bell, President; Michael Leeman, Vice President; Mark Monserez, Secretary; and Judith Shafkind, Treasurer. Committee members were also assigned on February 20th. If you would like to volunteer for an ABEVA Committee, please contact the ABEVA office.

Improvements

ROADS – Major improvements and seal coating were made to Biltmore Estates Drive and Colter Street in September 2016. This completes the major road repair and improvement project for ABEVA roads. In 2015 ABEVA improved Arizona Biltmore Circle and Claremont for drainage, filed and sealed cracks and all roads were seal coated. The cost for the project was \$347,817. Sealcoating is scheduled every 3 or 4 years with minor crack fill and sealcoating every year as needed.

Landscape – The grass was removed from under the oleanders along Biltmore Estates Drive. This will result in a water savings of over \$8,000 a year in water and maintenance costs.

Streetlights – 75 ABEVA owned street lights were changed to LED in 2016. It will save ABEVA \$7,000 to \$8,000 in maintenance and electric costs per year over the next 10 years, while the lights are under warranty. The return on investment will be realized in approximately 6 years.

Security

One of the major amenities of homeownership at the Biltmore is the reassuring presence of the Roving Patrol. January 1, 2017 ABEVA made a change in the company that provides the officers. Transcend Security Solutions has many state of the art electronic tracking and reporting methods that will be a great benefit to the security of the ABEVA members. ABEVA has 3 weekday and 2 weekend officers and 2 flex officers that cover three shifts seven days a week. Transcend will be providing 2 electric powered vehicles for patrolling the Biltmore. The monthly lease rate for both electric vehicles will be the same as the rate ABEVA was paying for one vehicle. Not having fuel costs will save over \$8,500 per year. The EV charging stations and the electric vehicles are scheduled to arrive in March.

The Roving Patrol drives 16 miles of road each tour - every 8 hours, 3 tours are completed thus 9 tours of the property take place every day. If you do the math, that is 52,560 miles a year, and they drive over 639 speed bumps/humps per day. I think most will agree we have an outstanding team of roving patrol guards blending both responsibility and courtesy. If you need additional Roving Patrol phone stickers, you may stop in the ABEVA office.

There were 140 ABEVA homes that changed ownership this past year vs. 149 in 2015, vs. 87 in 2014, vs. 145 in 2013. The 140 closings generated \$55,875 in Transfer and Disclosure fees. If selling your home, please remember you must disclose that you are a member of at least two associations - ABEVA and your sub association.

Collections

As of this date, there are 30 (vs. 65 last year on this date) homeowners that have not paid their 2016/2017 dues. They have all been sent Demand Letters. We make every effort to contact the owners before sending any account to the attorney for collections.

If the tear-off portion of the Statement and the member's correct account number are not included with payment, it is possible to credit the payment to the wrong account. If you are certain that you have already paid and you received a Demand Letter, please send us a copy of the front and back of your check so ABEVA's bank can remedy the situation and verify where the payment was credited.


